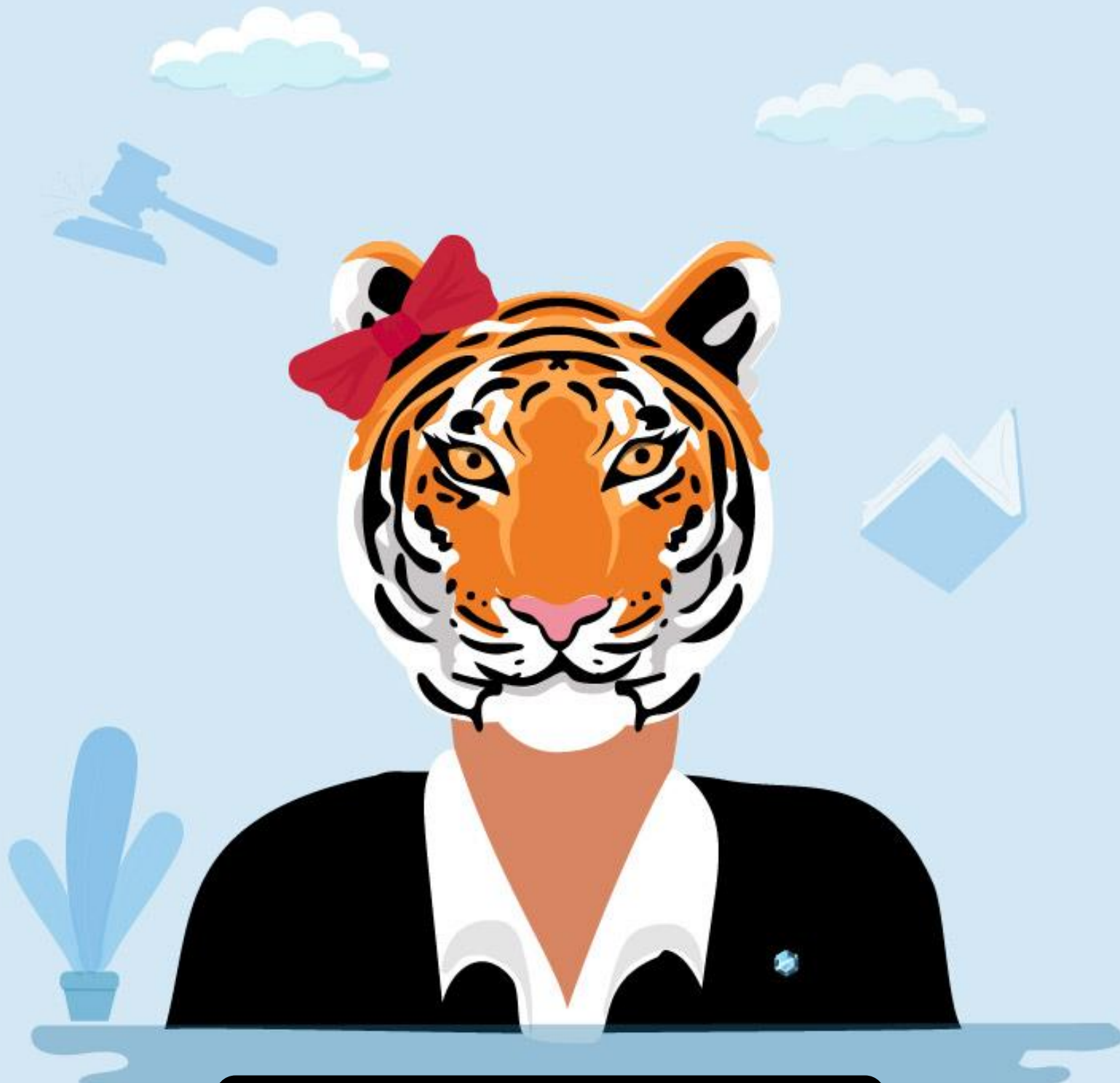

Section 326(A)

IPC

Voluntarily causing Grievous Hurt by use of Acid, etc

- Whoever causes permanent or partial **damage or deformity** to, or **burns or maims or disfigures or disables**, any part or parts of the body of a person or **causes grievous hurt by throwing acid** on or by administering acid to that person, or by using any other means with the intention of causing or with the knowledge that he is likely to cause such injury or hurt, shall be punished with :

Imprisonment of either description for a term which shall not be less than **ten years but which may extend to **imprisonment for life**, and with **fine****

Section 326(A)

IPC

Voluntarily causing Grievous Hurt by use of Acid, etc

You are sentenced to
imprisonment for life and
also liable to pay fine of
Rs. 20 Lakhs.



Provided that :

- Such fine shall be just and reasonable to meet the medical expenses of the **treatment of the victim**.
- Any fine imposed under this section shall be **paid to the victim**.

Voluntarily causing Grievous Hurt by use of Acid, etc

The expenses for the victim will be covered by accused. Please take good care of him and get him best treatment.



**The fine will be paid to
the victim to meet
his medical expenses.**

Cognizable & Non-Bailable

Section 326(B)

IPC

Voluntarily Throwing or Attempting to Throw Acid

- Whoever throws or **attempts to throw acid** on any person or attempts to administer acid to any person, or attempts to use any other means, with the **intention of causing** permanent or partial damage or deformity or burns or maiming or disfigurement or disability or grievous hurt to that person, shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which shall **not be less than five years** but which may extend to **seven years**, and shall also be **liable to fine**.

Section 326(B)

IPC

Voluntarily Throwing or Attempting to Throw Acid

Explanation 1 :

- Includes any substance which has **acidic or corrosive** character or burning nature, that is **capable of** causing **bodily injury** leading to scars or disfigurement or temporary or permanent disability.

Section 326(B)

IPC

Voluntarily Throwing or Attempting to Throw Acid

You are under arrest for attempting an Acid Attack.

You should be ashamed of yourself.



Imprisonment not be less than five years but may extend to seven years, and fine.

Explanation 2 :

- For the purposes of Section 326A and this section, permanent or partial damage or deformity shall not be required to be irreversible.

Cognizable & Non-Bailable

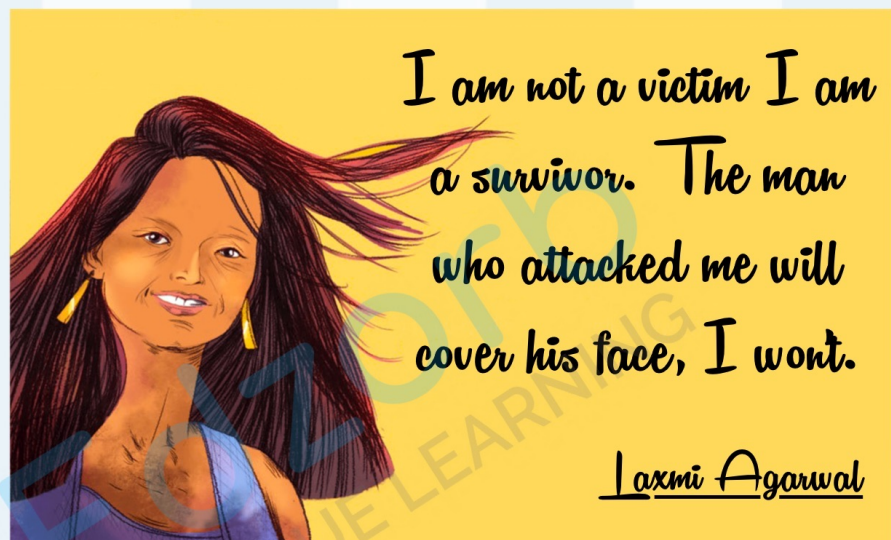

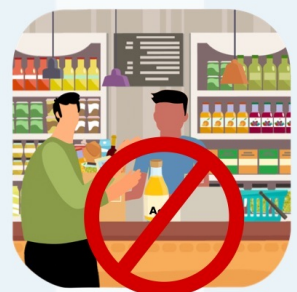

Laxmi v. Union of India

(2014) 4 SCC 427

Effect of the case:

- S. 357-A Amd. 2009 - Victim compensation scheme who have suffered loss or injury.
- S. 357-C Amd. 2013 - to provide for free medical treatment.
- S. 326-A and 326-B Amd. 2013 - to deal with acid attack.
- Victim compensation scheme got notified in all states and union territories of india.
- Directions were given for the minimum compensation of Rs. 3 lac to every acid attack victim in all states and union territories.
- The state government issued ban on sale of acid and declared acid as "poison" and which would not be easily available.

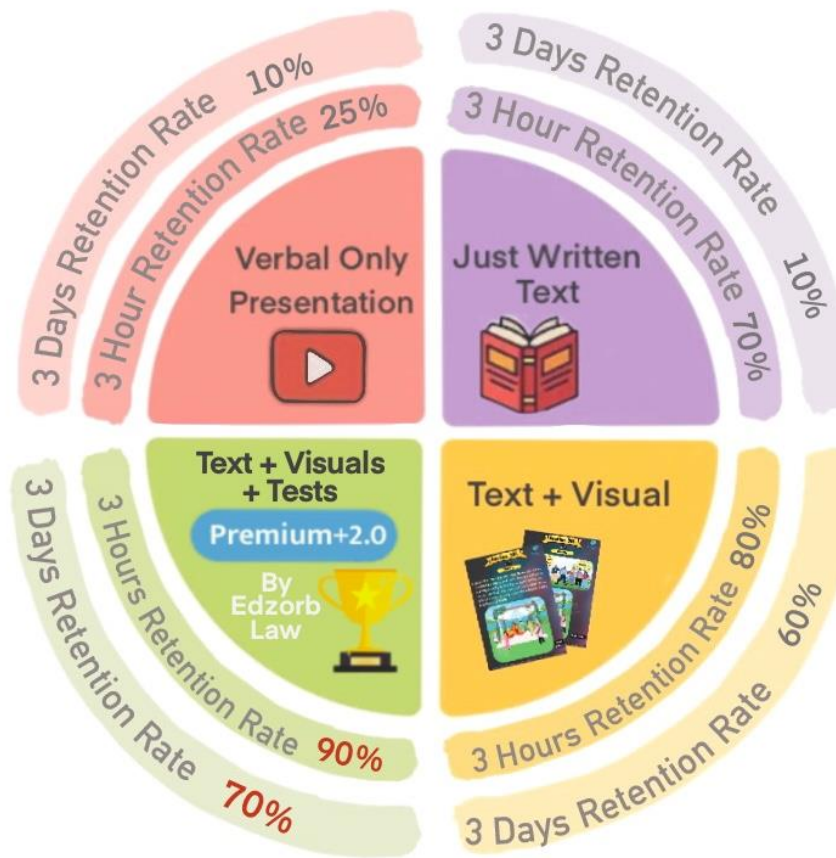

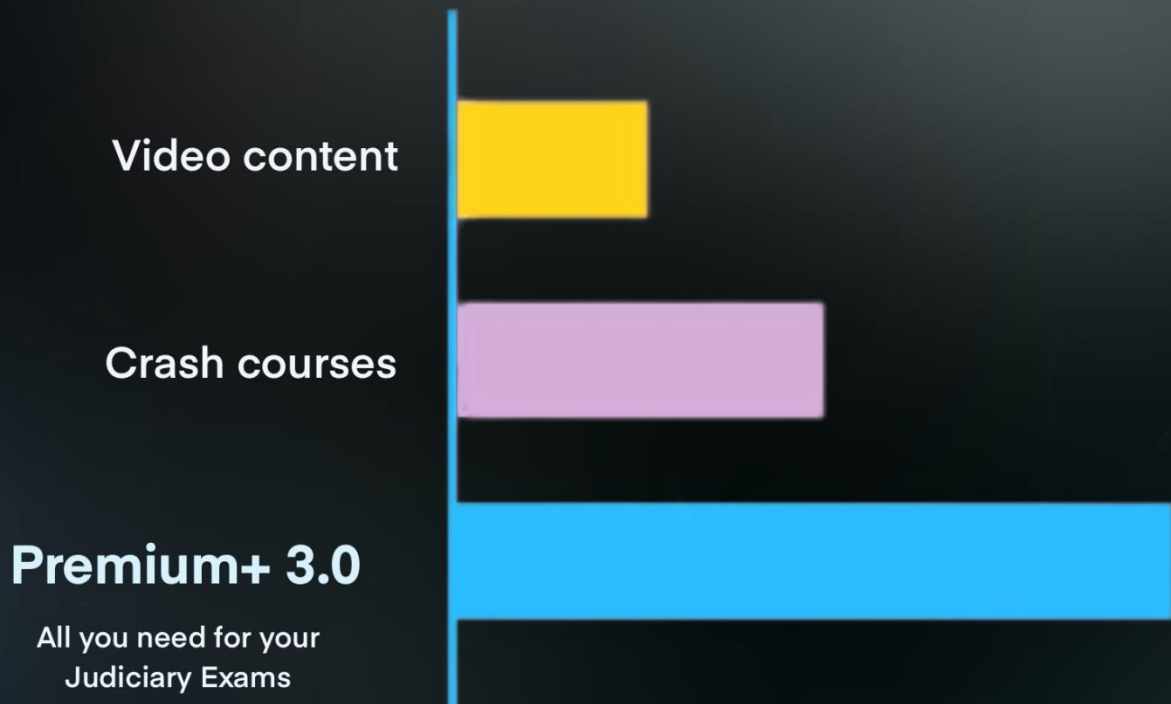

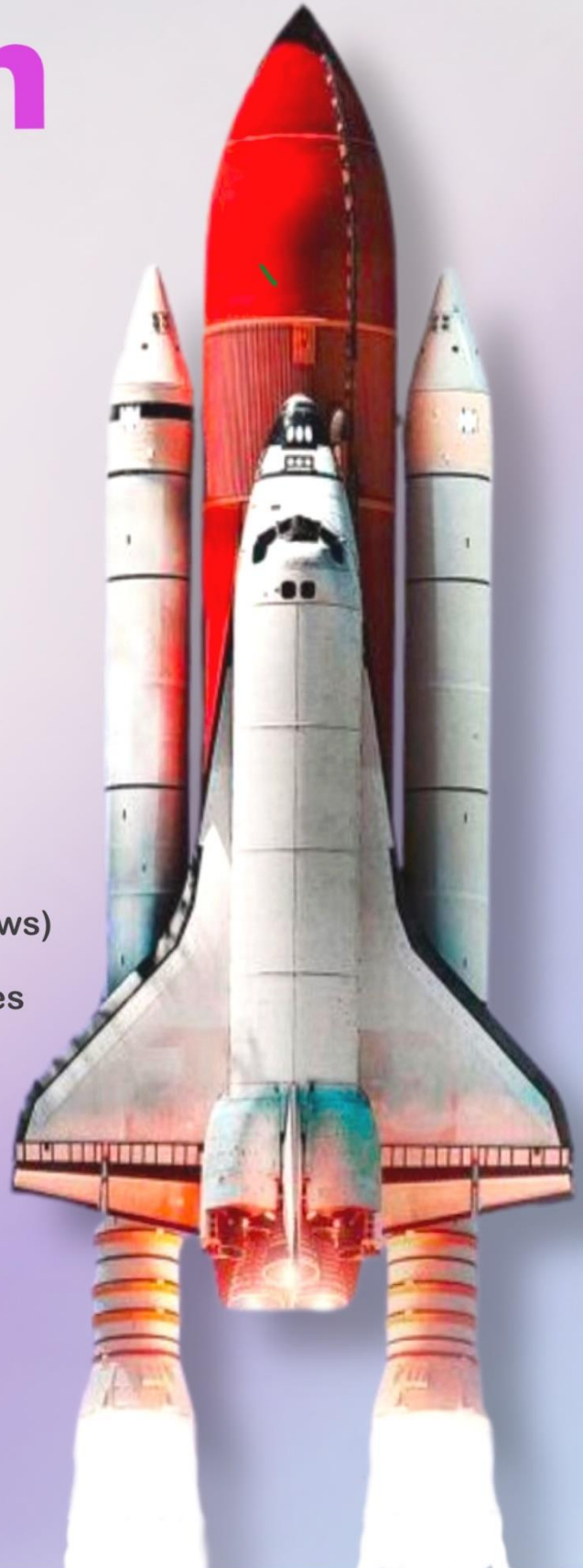
